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Executive Summary

This report briefly describes the communication and dissemination materials generated during the full duration of the NexusLinguarum COST Action (CA) CA18209, compiling links to all of them. This document describes the work done as of April 2024, that is mainly based on two main lines: through the NexusLinguarum website, with the publication of blog posts, policy briefs, publications, and reports, amongst others; and through the NexusLinguarum Twitter account, with posts on meetings, publications and organised events.

1. NexusLinguarum Website

The website is divided in six pages:

1. **The Action:** this page provides a description of the action and is divided into the following subsections: Objectives, Countries, Working Groups, Related Projects and Join Us (URL: <https://nexuslinguarum.eu/the-action/>).
2. **Activities:** this page includes different pages on the events derived from the Action: STSMs, Action Meetings, Training Schools, Inclusiveness Target Countries Conference Grants (ITC CG), Virtual Mobility Grants, Conferences and Workshops, Supported Events (URL: <https://nexuslinguarum.eu/1-portfolio-masonry/>).
3. **Results:** this page intends to collect resulting documents from the action, including Publications, Policy Briefs and Reports, which is subdivided in Deliverables and Completed STSMs, Virtual Mobility Grants and Inclusiveness Target Countries Conference Grants (URL: <https://nexuslinguarum.eu/results/>).
4. **Team:** this page presents the team that participates in the action. Participants are divided into the Core Group (coordinators) and the different Working Groups: WG1, WG2, WG3 and WG4 (URL: <https://nexuslinguarum.eu/team/>).
5. **Blog:** the blog gathers posts of varied nature, but mostly reporting STSMs and Workshops (URL: <https://nexuslinguarum.eu/blog-list/>).
6. **Working Area:** this is a private area with links to some ongoing works and the Nexus GitHub repository¹ (URL: <https://nexuslinguarum.eu/documentsinfo/>).

All the pages have been regularly updated during the years of the project, including The Action page, for instance, to make small adjustments to the objectives, or the Team page, to change tasks leadership and add new participants. The pages that have been more frequently updated are Activities, Results and Blog pages.

1.1. Activities

This page was updated with the activities organised by the Action, including:

- [Short-term scientific missions](#) (STSM), or exchange visits between researchers participating in a COST Action.
- [Action meetings](#) organised by a COST Action. They include Management Committee meetings, working group meetings, workshops and conferences
- [Training schools](#), which offered intensive interactive learning on topics related to the COST Action.

- [Conferences & Workshops](#), organised by NexusLinguarum on topics related to the Action. Those events allowed a deeper discussion on themes, on the basis of submissions done also by researchers not being involved in the Action.
- [Supported events](#), or conferences and workshops not directly organised as an Action event but supported scientifically (e.g., participation of Action members in the organising committee) and/or with publicity.

1.2. Results

This page was updated with Publications, Policy Briefs and Reports.

- [Publications](#). All the publications with acknowledgements to NexusLinguarum and related to their activities were documented in [Zenodo](#), where a NexusLinguarum community was created to that end. A plugin allowed to automatically import the publications list into the website. At the time of writing (more publications might appear in Zenodo in the incoming weeks), there are 64 scientific papers, 29 datasets, 4 presentations, 3 other types (training school materials), and 1 poster.
- [Policy Briefs](#). The Action produced two policy briefs in order to reach out stakeholders and to raise awareness about two important topics such as:

1.3. Blog

The blog includes 22 posts on a wide range of topics, including STSMs, events and working groups progress. We have tried to keep a minimum frequency of publication of one post per 2-3 months, rotating among different working groups.

2. NexusLinguarum Twitter Account

The NexusLinguarum Twitter account (@nexuslinguarum) 311 followers and follows 58 profiles.

The NexusLinguarum account published 225 posts, mainly related to publications by the participants, organised events and action meetings.

3. NexusLinguarum Internal Communication Strategies

The internal communication has mainly been done through different mailing lists and through the NexusLinguarum Slack working space.

In the NexusLinguarum working space there are 213 participants, and the communication was mainly done through the general channel, although other public and private channels were also used for specific purposes: working group updates, workshop organisation or specific use cases, for instance.
